1 LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

Charter for Compassion Society of Pakistan (CFC) Karachi, was registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, on May 17, 2011 as charitable organisation for the purpose of providing education and create awareness of the role that Compassion plays in facilitating peaceful interactions at individual, societal, national and global level. Its registered office is at 1st floor, Cotton Exchange Building, LL Chundrigar Road, Karachi.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION
